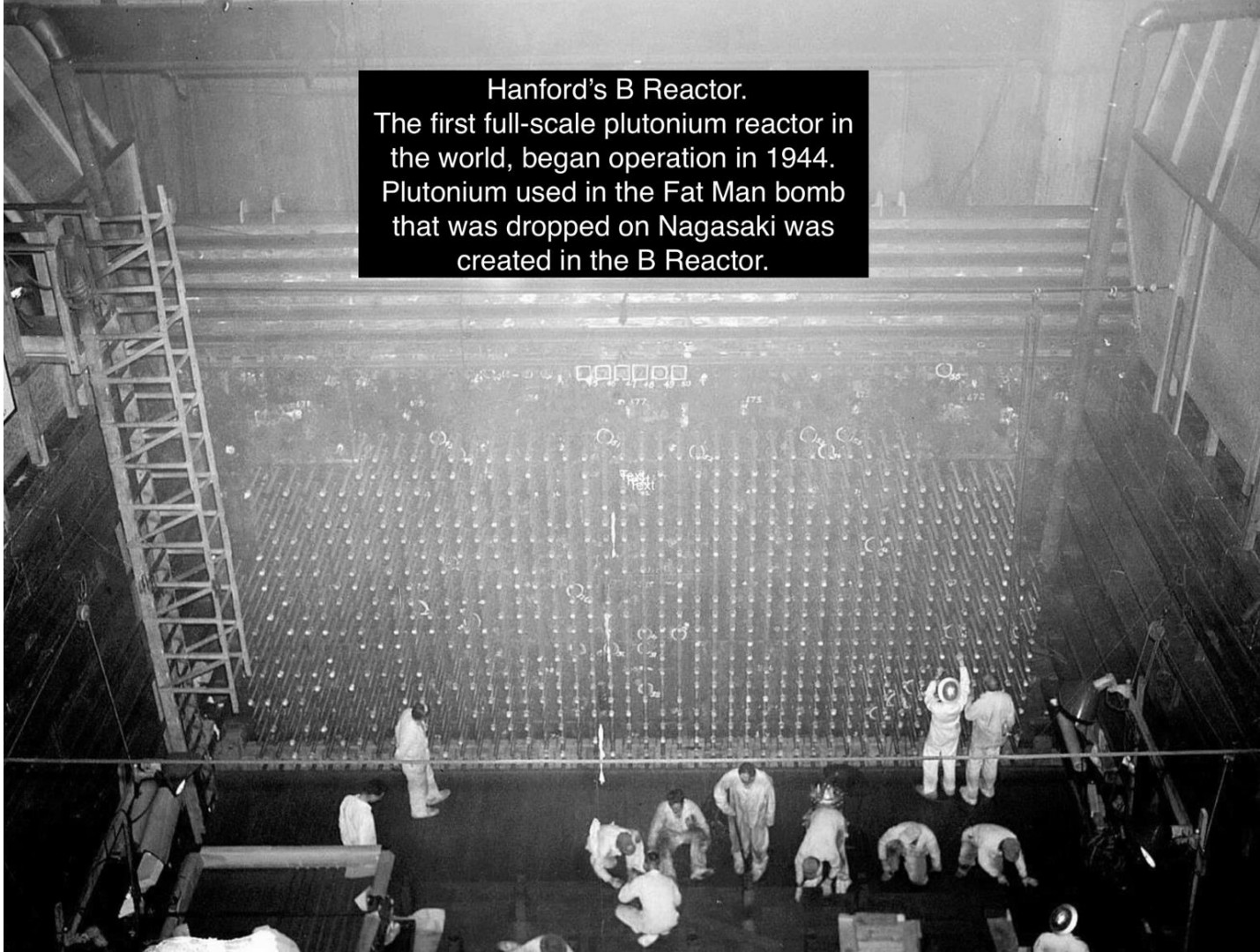
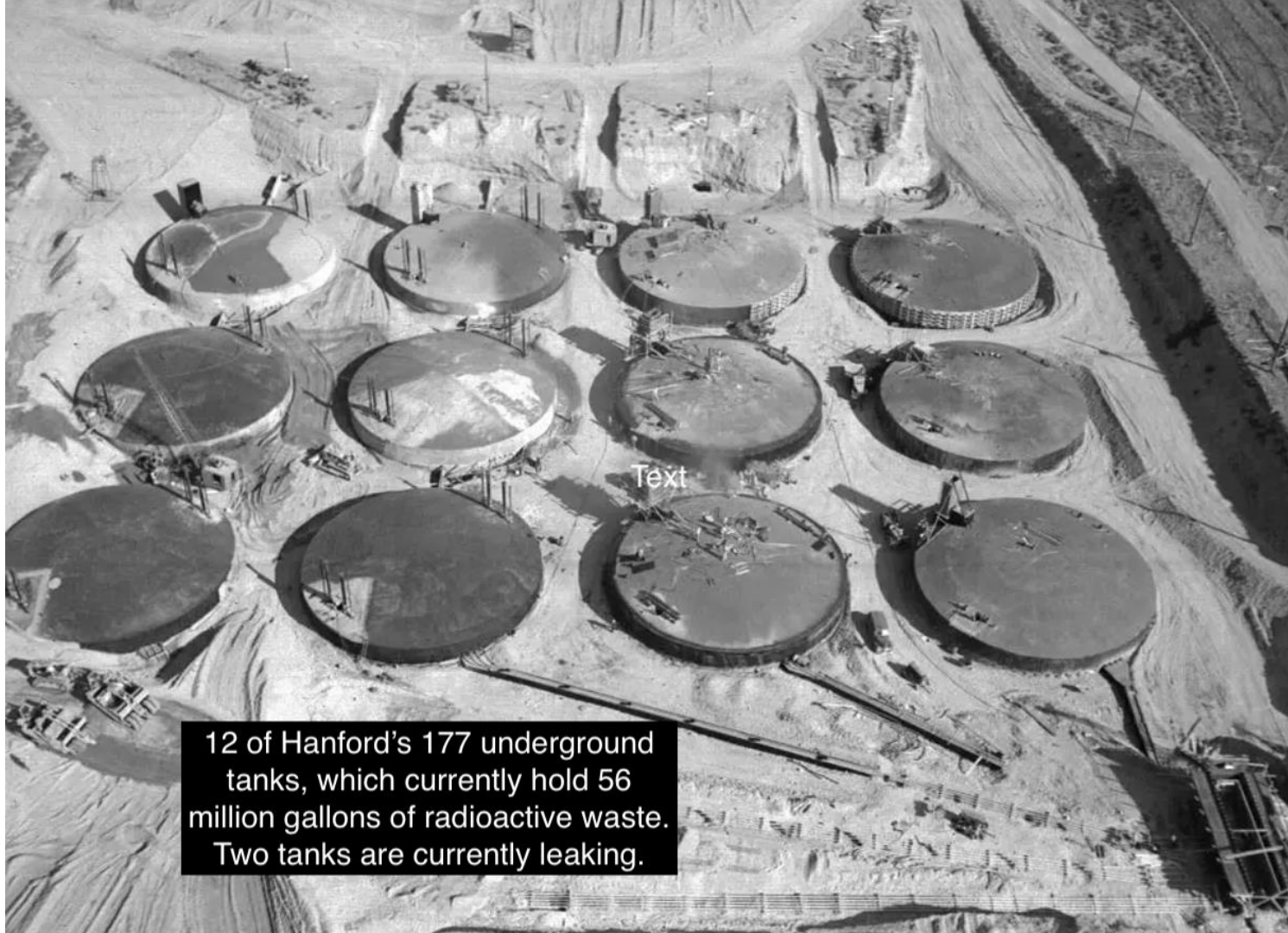




Hanford's B Reactor.

created in the B Reactor.

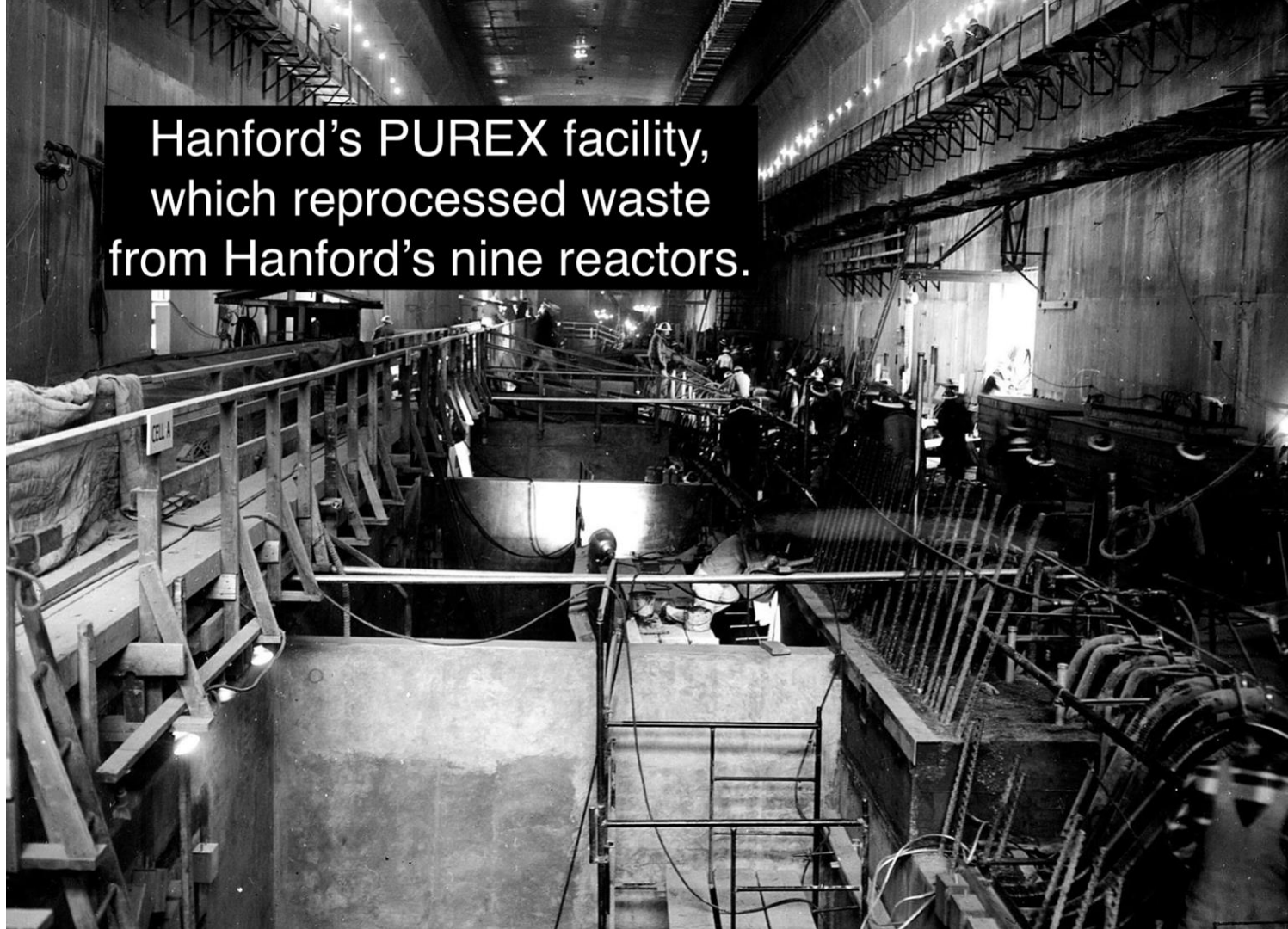




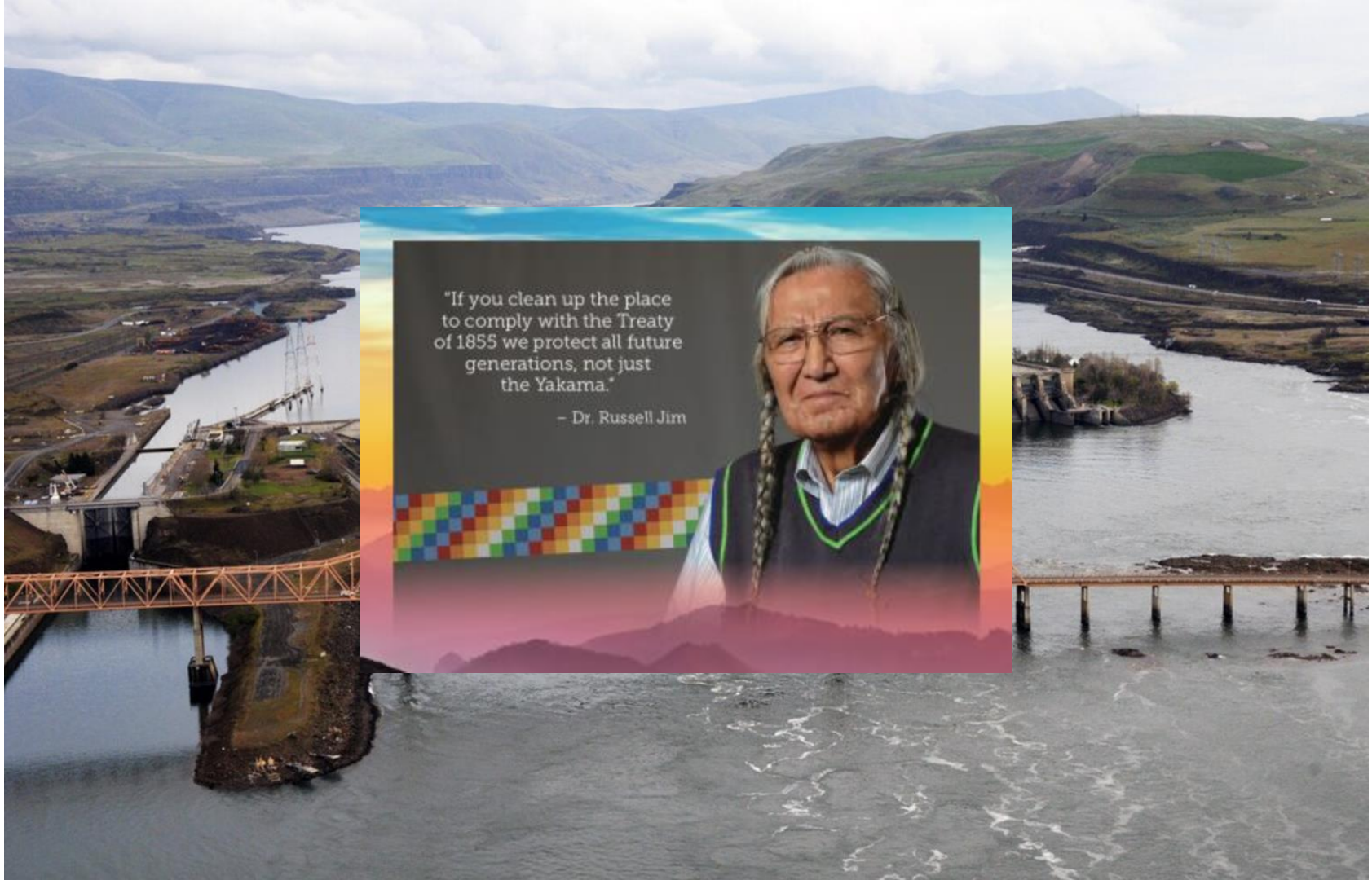
